Agenda Topic: Open Doors Outreach Network	Presenter: More Too Life
Discussion	<p>Dawn Sakes and Shavon Reed provided a presentation on Open Doors Outreach Network pilot project with More Too Life, an award winning anti-sexual violence, human trafficking, and youth crime prevention organization, founded by Dr. Brook Bello. Through the partnership, More Too Life provides assistance to human trafficking victims ages 10-24 through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A coordinated team of professions consisting of Survivor Mentors, Regional Advocates, and Clinicians, as well as support groups. • Immediate and ongoing care management 24/7/365 • Measures key youth program and system outcomes • Opportunities to leverage resources • Fills gaps within service delivery system in areas of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Cross sector collaboration for victims of Commercial Exploitation (CSE) and trafficking - Professional development and training - Trauma based/tested crisis intervention - Therapeutic services to meeting complex needs of victims

Agenda Topic: Civil Citation Data	Presenter: Kim Wiles
Kim Wiles presented Civil Citation Data for the circuit for the Nov 2016-Oct 2017. Circuit wide, 65% of the 645 eligible youth were issued civil citations. For Sarasota County, 65% of the 252 eligible youth were issued civil citations. For Manatee County, 72% of the 348 eligible youth were issued civil citations. For Desoto County, 11% of the 35 eligible youth were issued civil citations.	

Agenda Topic: DMC/RED Data	Presenter: Kim Wiles
Kim Wiles presented Disproportionate Minority Contact/Racial Ethnic Disparity data for the State's fiscal year 2015-16. The Relative Rate Index (RRI) is used to determine if the rate of occurrence for minority arrests is greater than the rate of arrests for white youth. When the RRI is greater than 1, the rate of arrest for minority youth is greater than white youth. The State Average RRI is 3.3. Sarasota County RRI is 4.3; Manatee County RRI is 3.5; and Desoto County RRI is 2.7.

<i>Discussion</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Executive – No report. • Direct File – The committee met on 11.15.17. Highlights from the meetings are as follows: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Legislation Update: Chair received the following information from SPLC: Rep. Shaw has filed the direct file reform bill in the House (HB 509). Sen. Powell is filing the bill in the Senate and it should be identical to the House bill. That was expected to occur this week. 2. Sgt. Nelson of SRQ County Jail reported that the jail is working on 2 jail staff being able to get certified to proctor the GED exam to allow for more frequent testing of juveniles and females at the jail. 3. Manatee County School District has a teacher assistant permanently assigned to the jail filled primarily to address services for ESE inmates over age 18. 4. Number of youth held in each jail as of the committee meeting: SRQ-8, MAN-10 including 1 female held by herself since October (per the jail, female is still being held as of 1.4.18) DeSoto-1 5. Next meeting 1.31.18, 3:00 in Sarasota. • DMC (Red Committee) –Next meeting will be held January 11, 2018 at Manatee Courthouse. Board discussed recruiting additional Sarasota representatives to meeting. • Faith – Larry Rose attended the 2017 Florida Faith Symposium will be held November 7-8 at the Rosen Centre in Orlando. This is one of Florida’s premier events that brings together more than 500 faith and state

	<p>government leaders to highlight opportunities, facilitate connections, and initiate action to empower Florida’s children and families to become productive and self-sufficient.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grants – No new grants to review from DJJ this quarter. • Legislative – Updates were provided by Michelle Morton from ACLU as follows: Civil Citations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Sen. Bracy’s SB 644 passed the Senate Criminal Justice Committee and is now in CJ Approps. The House companion (HB 489, Pritchett) has been referred to committees. The bill includes a list of mandatory civil citation misdemeanors. ✓ Another bill, which creates a similar program for adults, has been filed in the House (HB 1197, Ahern) and Senate (SB 1392). The Senate version would substantially change the juvenile civil citation statute to leave most specifics to circuits, which would operate the programs. Public Records: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ A bill to exempt records of juveniles deemed serious or habitual juvenile offenders and those charged with felonies (or offenses that would be felonies if adult) has been filed in the House (HB 349, Jacquet) and Senate (SB 598). General Juvenile Justice: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ A bill to allow certain officials to visit state-operated or overseen juvenile facilities at their pleasure has been filed in the House (HB 361, Richardson/Stafford) and Senate (Brandes) ✓ SB 1264, by Sen. Steube, would double the minimum cost of prosecution for misdemeanors and felonies, for both adults and juveniles. The House companion is HB 1003, Gonzalez ✓ SB 1298, by Sen. Brandes, would require secure detention for prolific juvenile offenders who violate nonsecure detention and would require courts consider predisposition reports before committing youth. Bracy has picked this up in his SB 1552. ✓ Legislation from the DJJ to implement the new DRAI is expected • Nomination/Membership – Put forth nominations for Chair and Vice-Chair, as appropriate. • Planning – No report.
