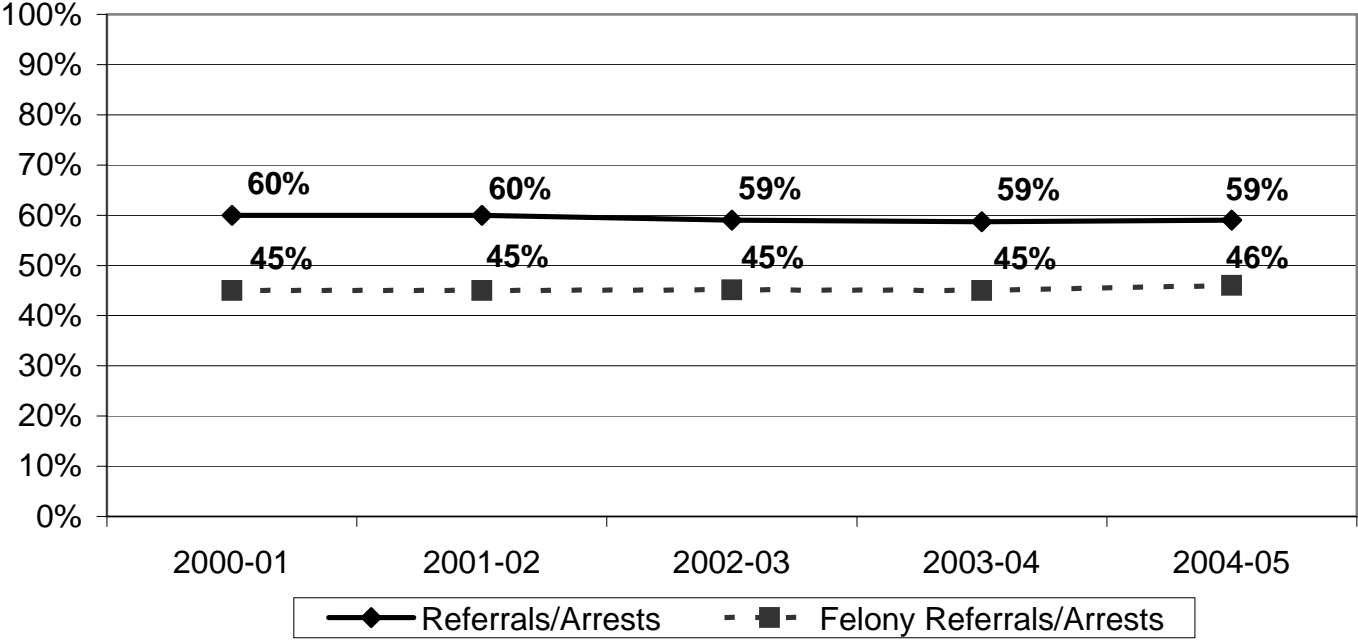

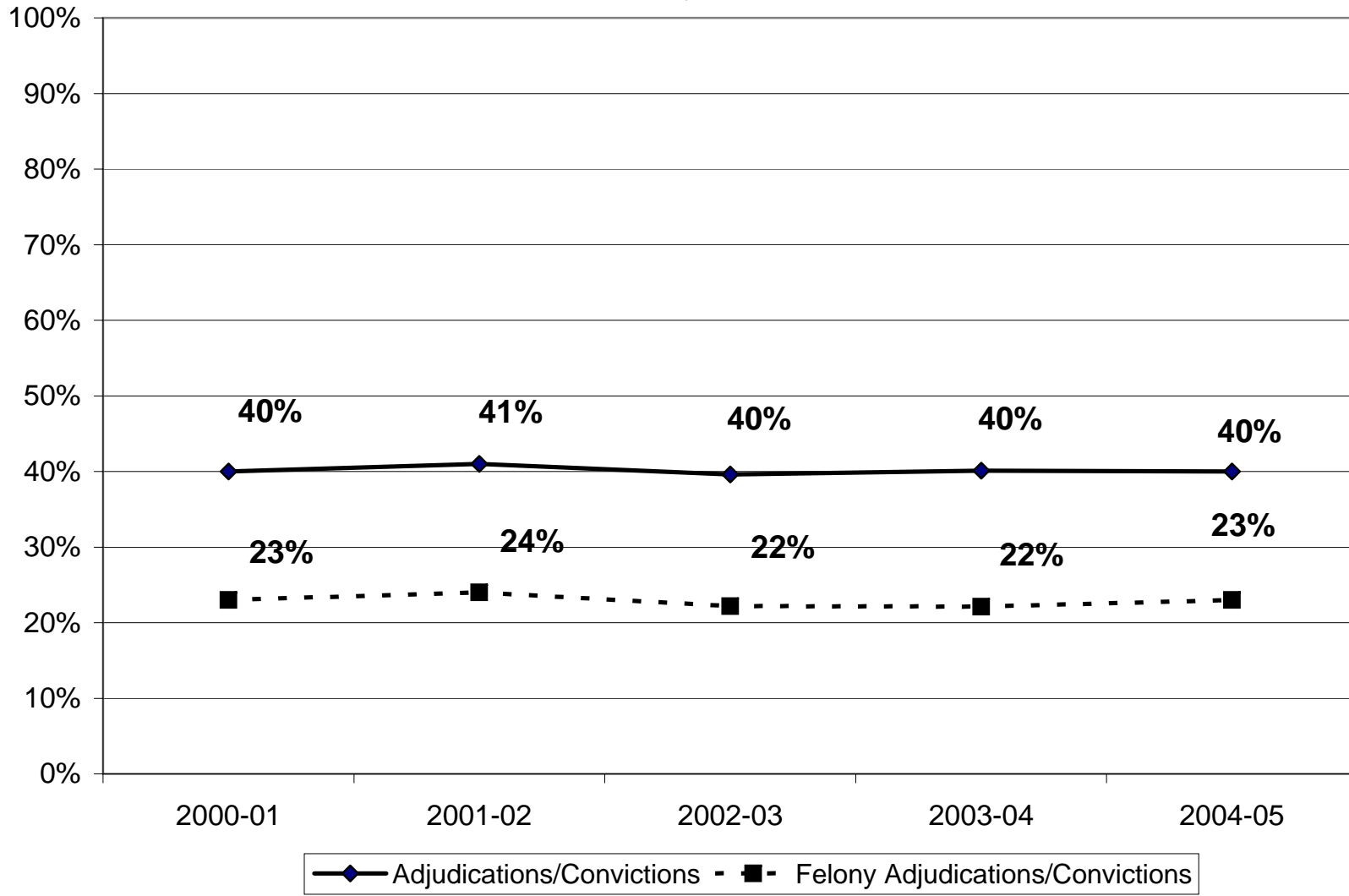

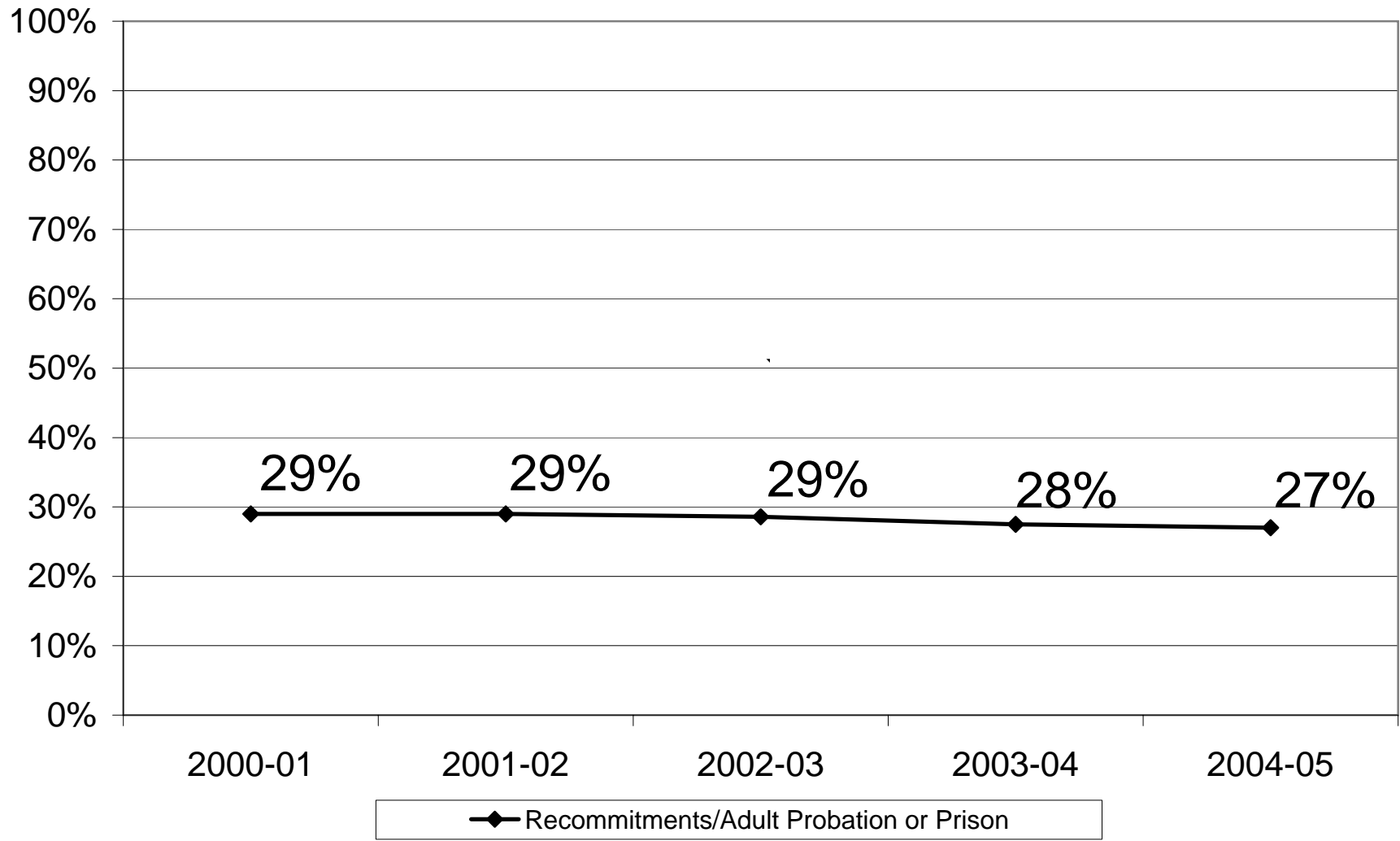
**Residential Commitment

by Fiscal Year**



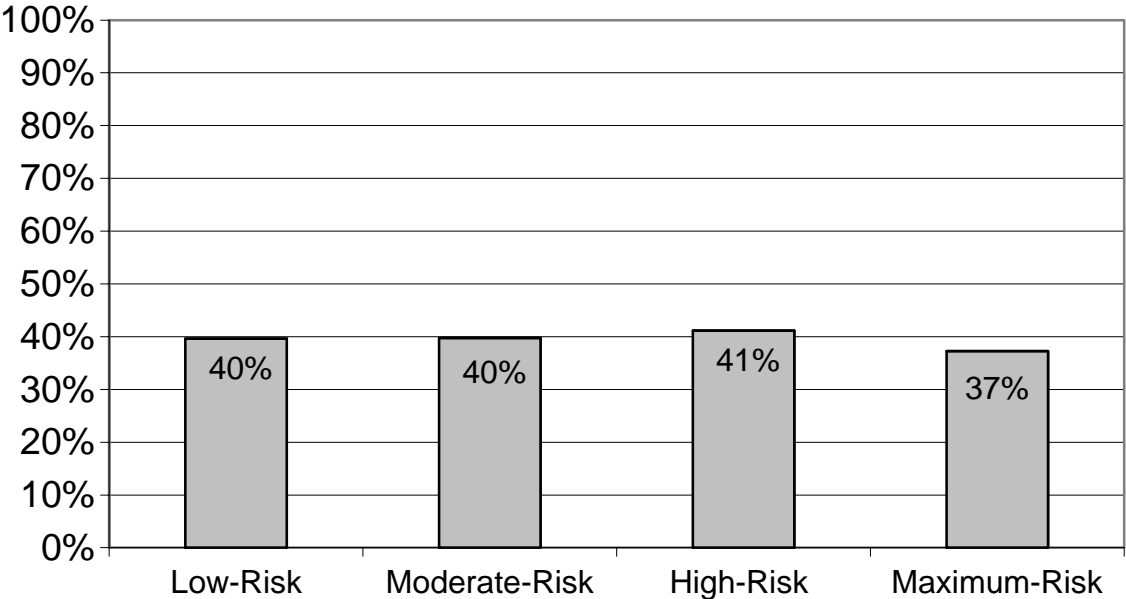
### Residential Commitment Subsequent Adjudication and Conviction Rates by Fiscal Year

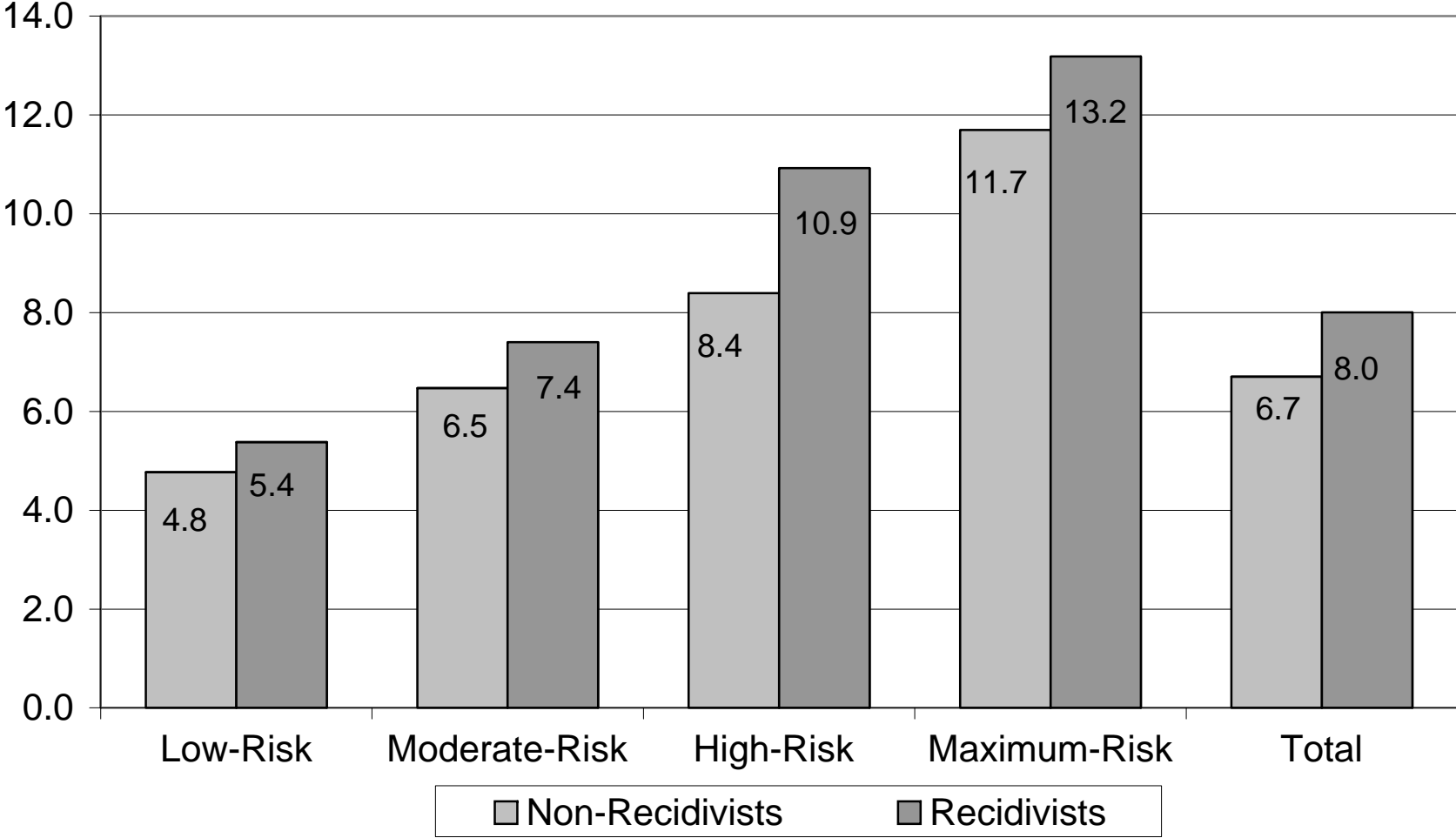

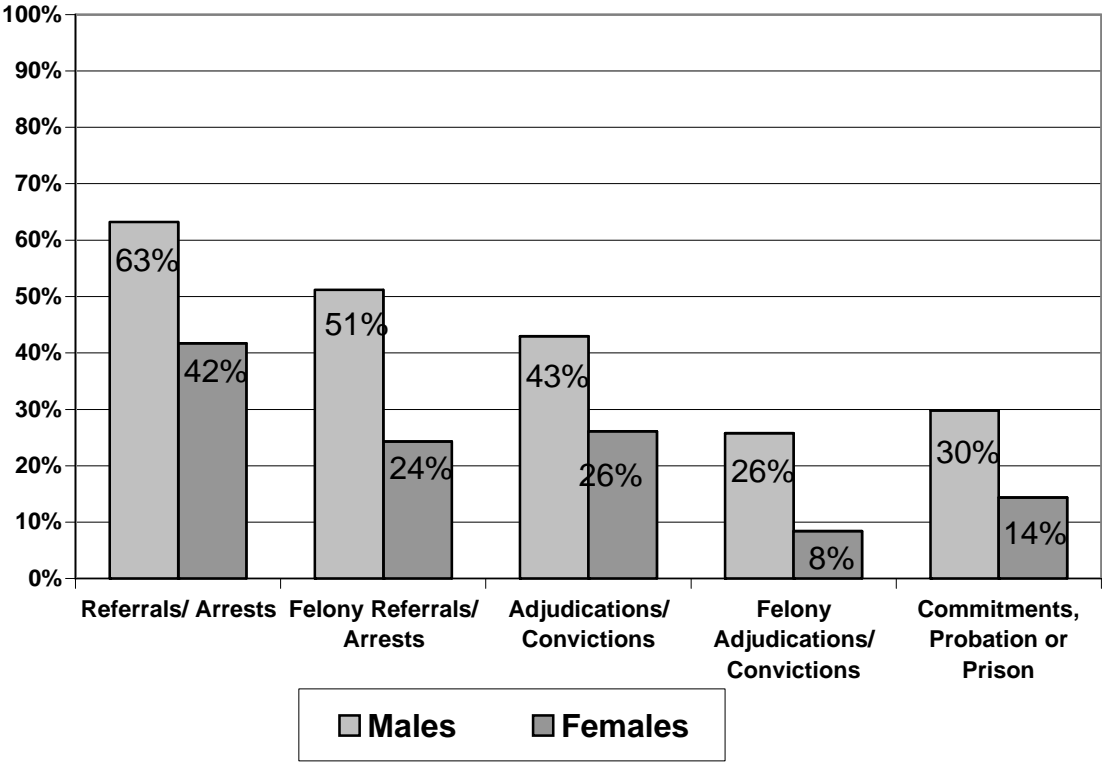

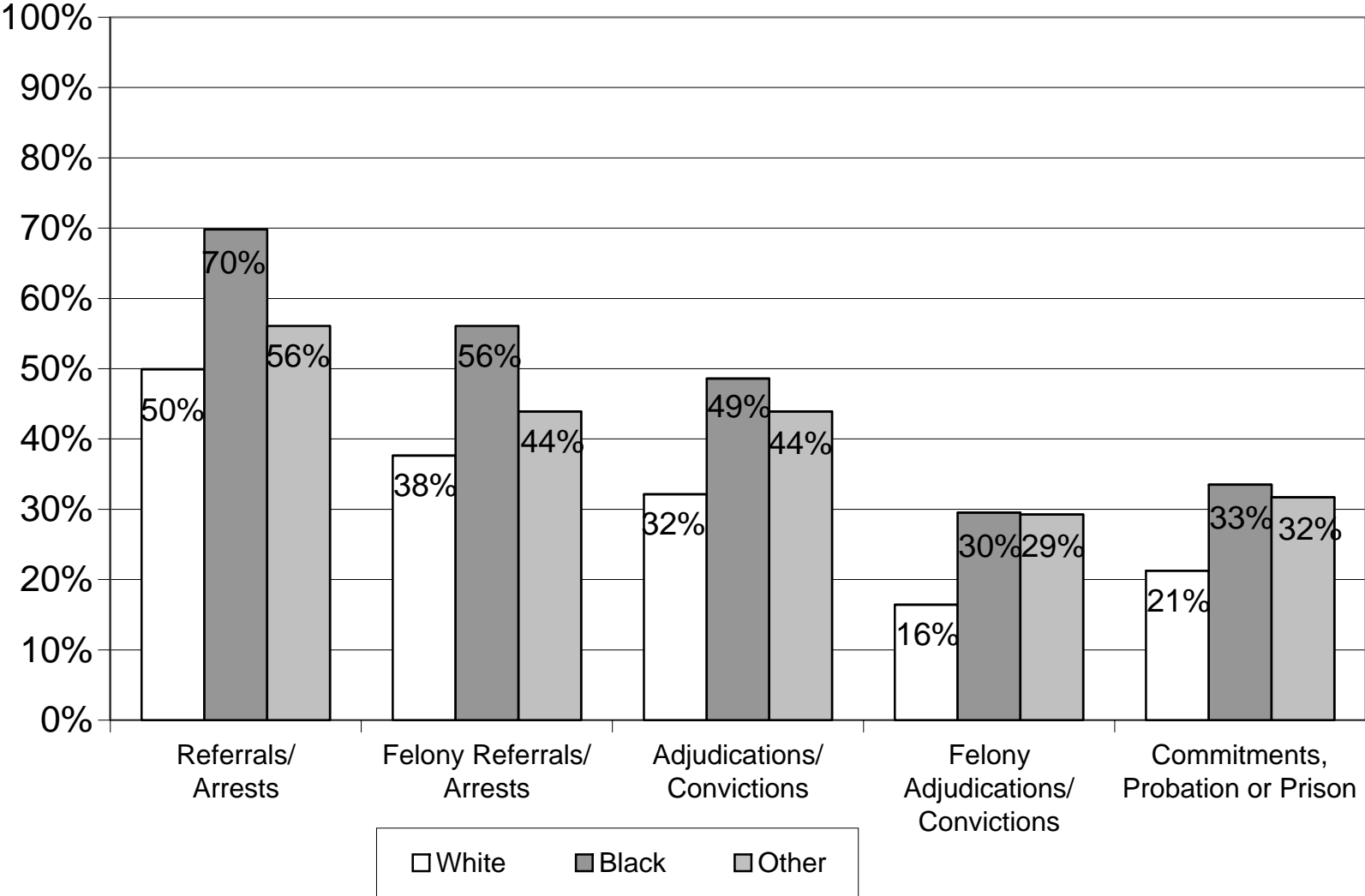


# Residential Commitment FY 2004-05 Recidivism Measures by Gender

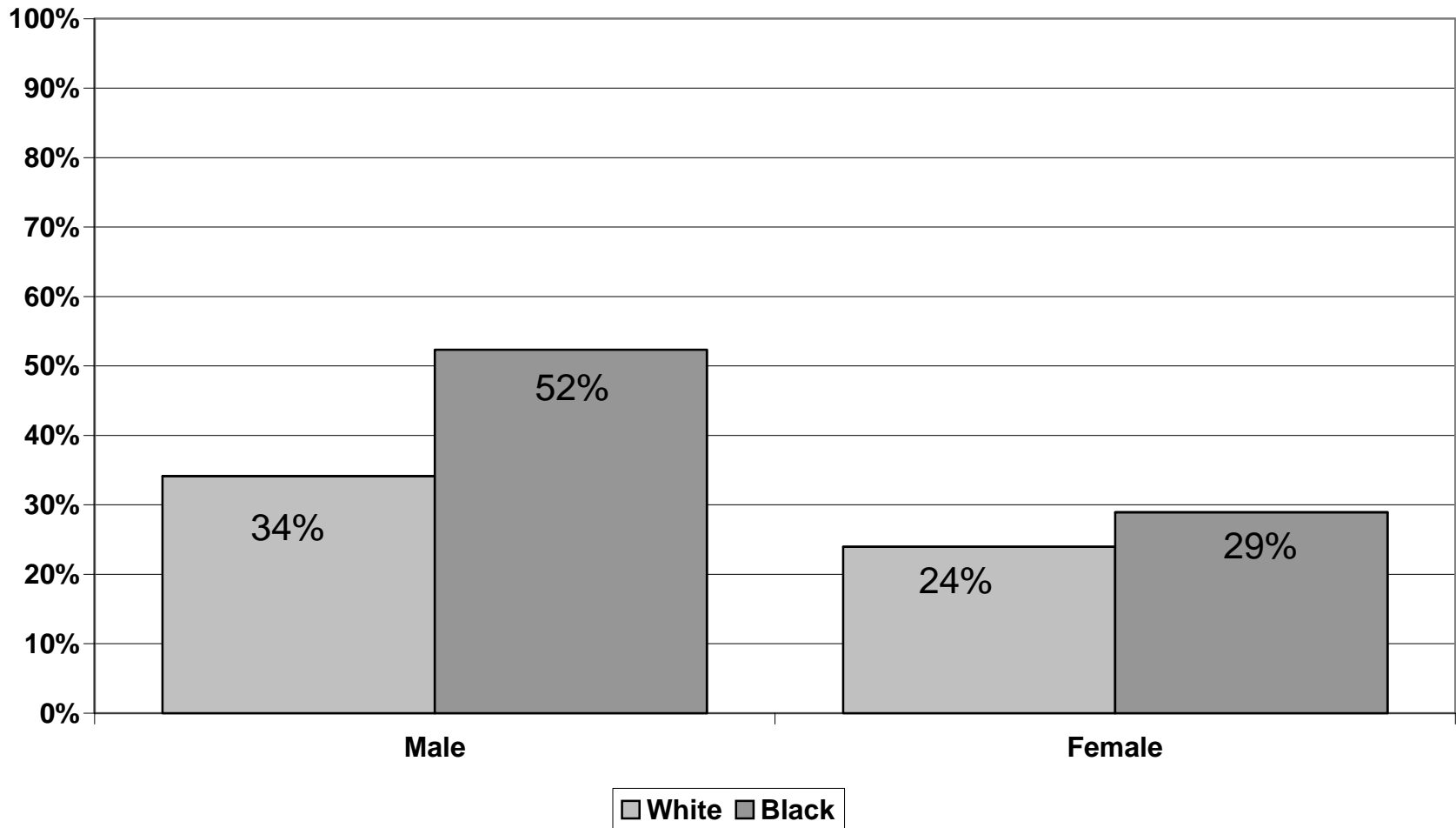




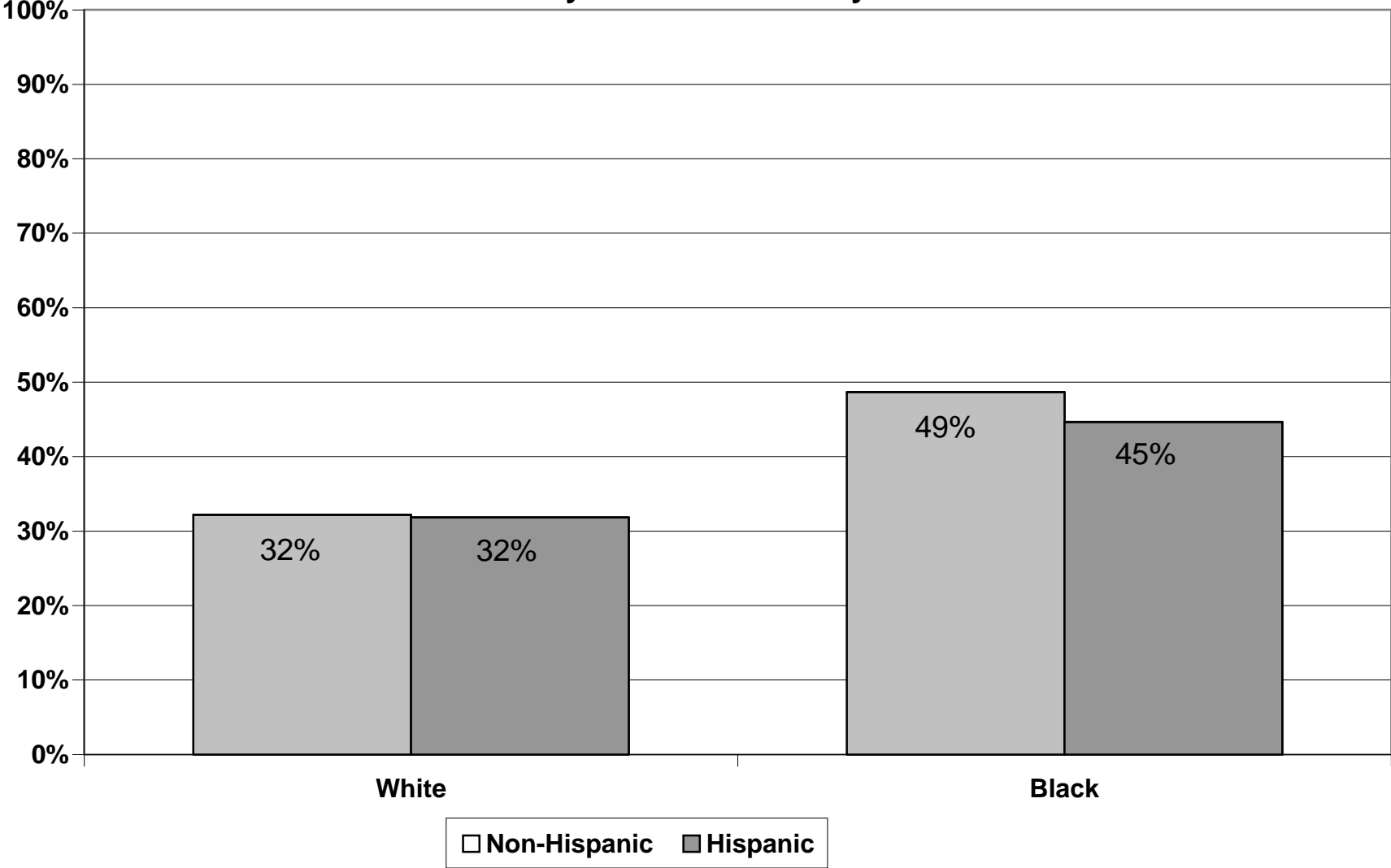
Residential Commitment FY 2004-05  
Recidivism Measures by Race



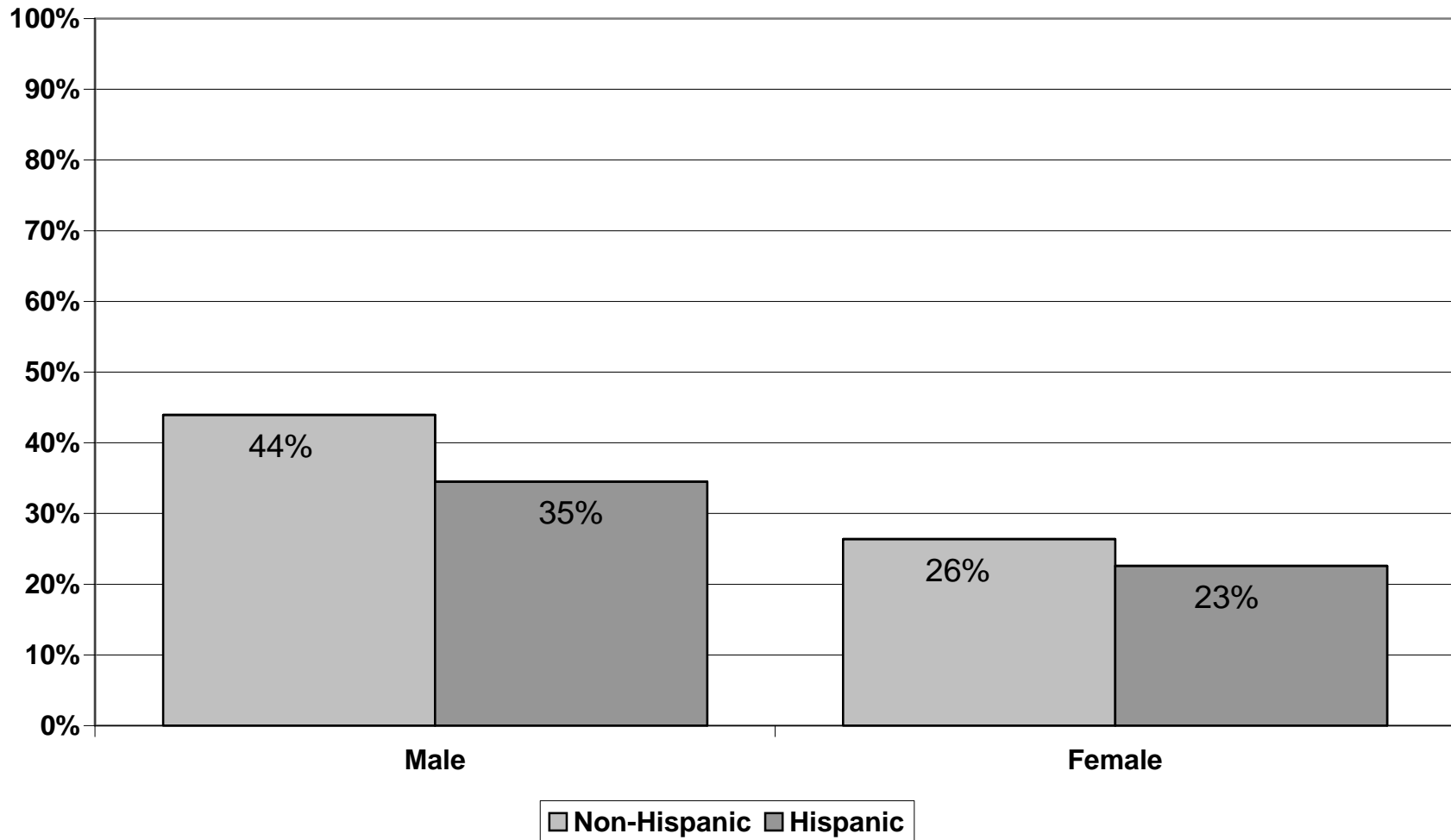
**Residential Commitment FY 2004-05

by Race and Gender**



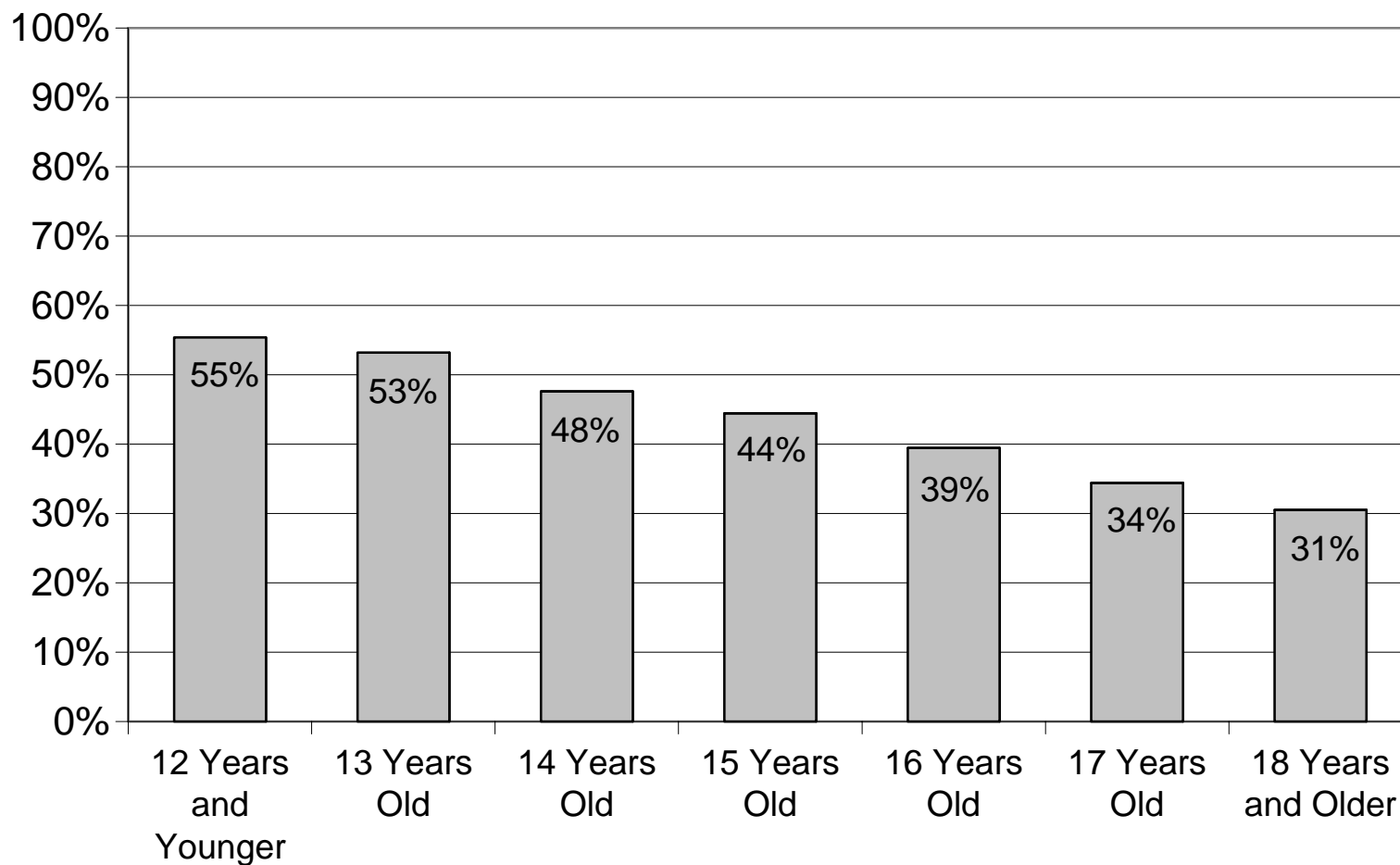
