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*Relative Rate Index (RRI) is the OJJDP-recommended measure of DMC/RED. The RRI, ranging from zero to infinite positive numbers, compares the occurrence rate of minority youth to the occurrence rate of white youth within various points of the juvenile justice continuum of services.

National RRI: 3.0

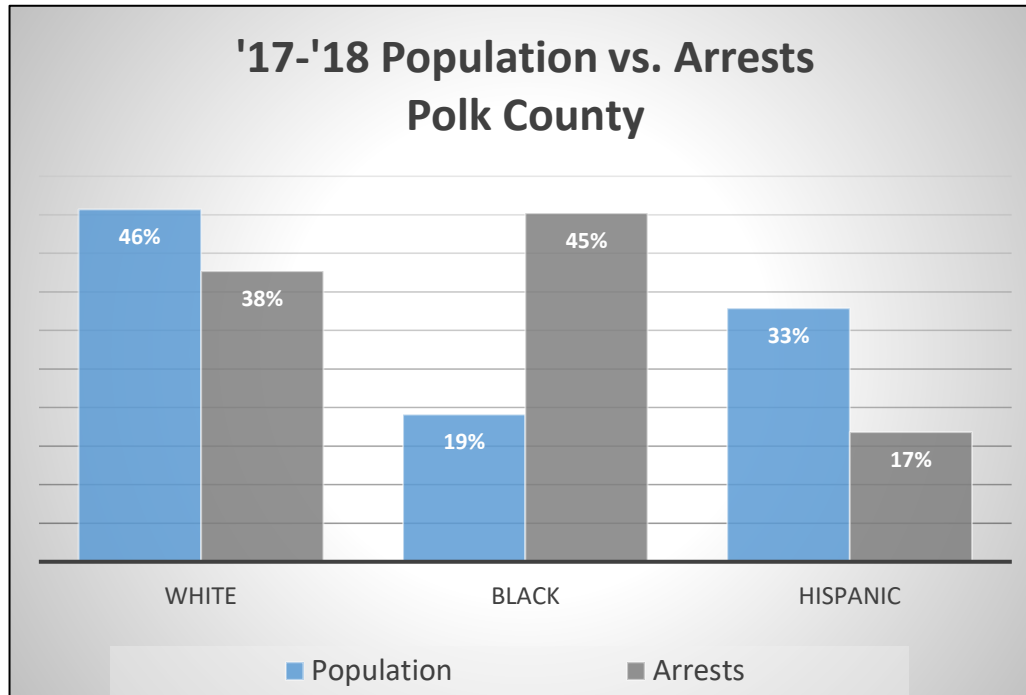
State RRI: 3.1

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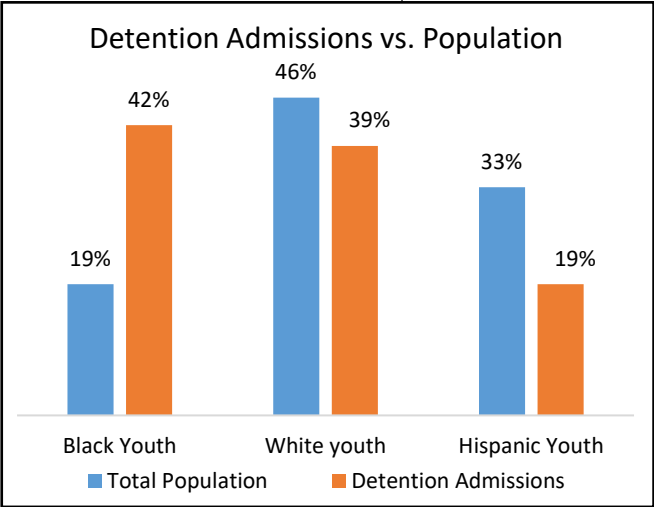

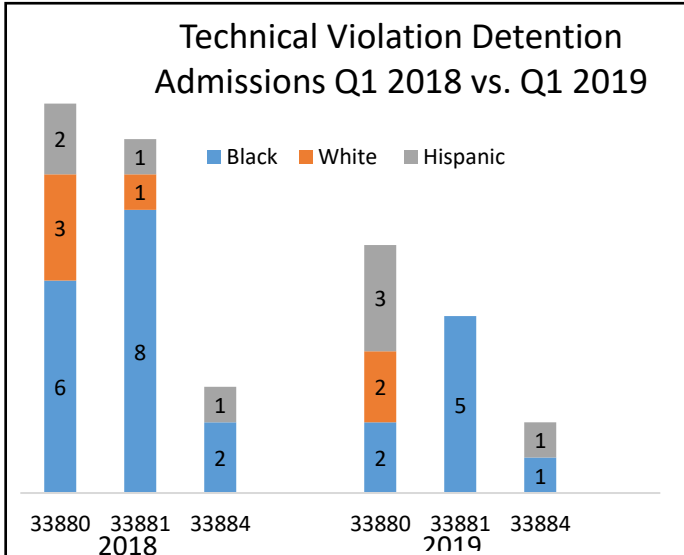
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Based on the data, more black youth are disproportionately placed in secure detention.

Increase communication amongst agencies to reduce LEO violations within Winter Haven area (33880, 33881, 33882, 33884). JPOS receive emails daily about compliance with curfew, and JPO addresses noncompliance with EM instead of a LEO VOP/ technical VOP.
