<b>Subject:</b> SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTION SCREENING		<b>Reference:</b> Health Services Manual 5-3 Quality Improvement Standard 4.18	
<b>Purpose:</b>	The purpose of this policy is to ensure all youth are evaluated and treated (if necessary) for sexually transmitted infections (STIs).		

**PROCEDURE:**

- A. All sexually active youth will be clinically screened and evaluated for Sexually Transmittable Diseases (STI's). After Screening, youth will be referred to the DHA or ARNP to determine if further testing is indicated. Screening and referral will be accomplished using the Department's most current STI form.
- B. The results of STI tests will be noted on the Infectious and Communicable Disease (ICD) form and the lab results will be located in the IHCR behind the corresponding tab. Documentation of treatment will also be noted on the Infectious and Communicable disease form within the IHCR. The ICDF is a highly confidential form and should not be provided to anyone outside the medical field who is involved with treatment or care of the youth.
- C. Rescreening should be conducted if the sexually active youth has been out of DJJ custody for over thirty days and/or symptoms are present.
